

#### **WSA PROCESS**

WSA partners in 182 countries organize local pre-selections

(contests, expert committees) to select the best local digital solutions and submit them to the global W. SA call. 1 submission / country / category

#### ~ 600 ENTRIES

from 120 countries nominated for WSA

### Online Jury

100 international experts (multi-stakeholder, genderbalanced) evaluate all entries online via the W.SA database

#### WSA SHORTLIST

~ 20 projects / W.SA category and presented to the W.SA Crand Jury

### Grand Jury

20 international jurors select the 40 W.SA winners in a 3 day democratic process








### WSA Timeline 2019 / 2020















### What WSA is looking for...



The creative & smart use of ICT's to solve local issues. Content is more important than tech innovation. Be it a simple SMS based application, a creative app, an online platform or a content driven hardware solution - it's the unique content and the high local impact that counts.

Judges focus on the appropriateness of the application - does the application face the local challenges and needs?

Matching to the proposed target group.

Accessibility for users: the database application for WSA must be in English, the project's content can be in any language of the UN.

In the best case, the nominations should be transferrable to other countries/regions, or be best practices.

ICT's being used for social impact and tackling the UN SDG's.

WSA winners have to be introduced to the market – no proto-types or beta versions; they have to prove already some local impact and market relevance.

They should also not be older than 2 years, the company itself can be older and established, but the product/solution itself shouldn't be older...

We highly recommend checking the recent WSA winning projects.
